2026 Property Tax Bills Delayed Due to Statewide Legislation

Gainesville, GA (September 14, 2026) – Hall County Tax Commissioner Darla Eden CPA is informing residents that 2026 property tax bills for real estate and personal property will be mailed later than the traditional September 15 date. This change is due to continuing conditions resulting from last year's legislation and constraints associated with the digest preparation software used outside the Tax Commissioner's Office, delaying completion of the 2026 tax digest and extending the timeline for finalizing and mailing property tax bills.

"We are committed to providing Hall County residents with accurate property tax bills, which we anticipate mailing in mid-October," said Eden. "We are optimistic about future modernization efforts that will better integrate the systems that are used throughout the property tax process. Updated, connected technology will improve efficiency, strengthen coordination, and ultimately provide better service."

Although the mailing date will shift, the due date will remain 60 days from the date the bills are mailed, giving taxpayers the standard window to plan and make payment.
